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Executive Summary

This document details a community led action plan that showcases a vision for the progressive development of Baddaginnie. The document also outlines the plan to both maintain and enhance the future prosperity of the township through ongoing planning and development of the town and its community members, including infrastructure, maintenance, community inclusion & promotion and events to increase tourism.

Vision Statement

To improve Baddaginnie for residents to reside and work, visitors to stay, and for the future prosperity of Baddaginnie from a social, economic, recreational and environmental perspective; whilst maintaining the character intrinsic to the community.

To engender good-will, build partnerships between local groups and the residents of Baddaginnie, and promote a spirit of co-operation. To ensure initiatives have a greater likelihood of being supported, by how they are perceived by the community and for volunteers to support projects.

Purpose of the Township Plan

The Baddaginnie Township Plan is based on the ideas, hopes and aspirations of the Baddaginnie community together with the Benalla Rural City Council (BRCC). The Township Plan aspires to guide the future development of the town by developing a list of projects and priorities to inform council strategic planning and to support the community to apply for grants when funding is available.

The plan:

- Articulates the issues that are important to Baddaginnie residents
- Provides a clear blueprint for the future development of the Baddaginnie township and surrounding region
- Assists the Baddaginnie community to attract local and state funding to help achieve identified priorities and projects
- Provides a coordinated approach for the social, cultural and economic development of the township and surrounding enterprises
- Aspires to promote Baddaginnie as a tourism destination & as a great place to live

Alignment to BRCC Community Plan & Vision 2036


The Baddaginnie Township Plan aligns with the BRCC Community Plan and Vision 2036 documents respectively as together they seek to provide a pathway to the development of individual towns and the rural area of Benalla as a whole.

The information in this document has been collated from a number of sources including the Benalla Rural City Council website, previous community consultations and grant applications, previous town action plans, various other council documents and google and Facebook searches. Information may be updated, changed and further developed by the Baddaginnie community to specifically reflect the communities' actions, plans and priorities.

Location

Baddaginnie is a small township situated 10km southwest of Benalla on the former Hume Highway. The township is located 1.5km north of the Hume Freeway and is best described as a dormitory suburb of Benalla. Baddaginnie is situated 12 kilometres south of Benalla on the Benalla-Baddaginnie Road.





History of Baddaginnie

Baddaginnie was the name given to the local township by Sri Lankan railway workers building the Melbourne-Sydney rail line in the 1860s. According to local legend, when provisions failed to arrive at the settlement, the Sri Lankan men named their camp 'baddaginnie' meaning 'empty belly'.


The town was surveyed in 1857, but settlement was slow, a Post Office finally opening on 16 September 1879. A railway station was open and served passengers until July 1978. A Primary school was opened in Baddaginnie in 1875 and has been running since.

Baddaginnie Today*


Baddaginnie is serviced by an active CFA Brigade, retains a primary school and has a daily mail delivery service. The town is provided with an unpotable reticulated water system operated by Baddaginnie Water Co-operative Limited. The Baddaginnie Community Hall is regularly used for various functions, as is the George Palmer Recreation Reserve for tennis and other public occasions. The town has an op-shop which opens every second Saturday.


At the 2016 census, Baddaginnie and the surrounding area had a population of 343; 179 males and 164 females. Of these, 20 residents were born overseas and 23 require assistance due to age or disability. Education statistics show 15 children attend pre - school or primary school, 17 attend secondary school and 8 attend TAFE. According to housing statistics, 57 residents own their homes, 52 are purchasing and 18 are renting.


POPULATION BY AGE
