Executive Summary

This document details a community led action plan that showcases a vision for the progressive development of Swanpool. The document also outlines the plan to both maintain and enhance the future prosperity of the township through ongoing planning and development of the town and its community members, including infrastructure, maintenance, community inclusion & promotion and events to increase tourism.

Vision Statement

To improve Swanpool for residents to reside and work, visitors to stay, and for the future prosperity of Swanpool from a social, economic, recreational and environmental perspective; whilst maintaining the character intrinsic to the community.

To engender good-will, build partnerships between local groups and the residents of Swanpool, and promote a spirit of co-operation. To ensure initiatives have a greater likelihood of being supported, by how they are perceived by the community and for volunteers to support projects.

Purpose of the Township Plan

The Swanpool Township Plan is based on the ideas, hopes and aspirations of the Swanpool community together with the Benalla Rural City Council (BRCC). The Township Plan aspires to guide the future development of the town by developing a list of projects and priorities to inform council strategic planning and to support the community to apply for grants when funding is available.

The plan:

- Articulates the issues that are important to Swanpool residents
- Provides a clear blueprint for the future development of the Swanpool township and surrounding region
- Assists the Swanpool community to attract local and state funding to help achieve identified priorities and projects
- Provides a coordinated approach for the social, cultural and economic development of the township and surrounding enterprises
- Aspires to promote Swanpool as a tourism destination & as a great place to live


Alignment to BRCC Community Plan & Vision 2036

The Swanpool Township Plan aligns with the BRCC Community Plan and Vision 2036 documents respectively as together they seek to provide a pathway to the development of individual towns and the rural area of Benalla as a whole.

The information in this document has been collated from a number of sources including the Swanpool & District Community website, Benalla Rural City Council website, previous community consultations and grant applications, google and Facebook searches and various other council documents. Information may be updated, changed and further developed by the Swanpool community to specifically reflect the communities' actions, plans and priorities.

Location:

Swanpool is in the heart of the Broken River Valley and is located 25kms south-east of Benalla along the Midland Highway. It is 2.5 hours' drive north-east from Melbourne. The town is at the foothills of the Victorian High Country and surrounded by mountain ranges and waterways. To the south, Mount Samaria reflects in the waters of Lake Nillahcootie – home to all kinds of recreational boating and fishing; to the west are the Strathbogie Ranges with numerous recreational driving and walking tracks.



History of Swanpool:


The area around Swanpool was originally inhabited by the Wurundjeri people, as part of a tract of land in Northeast Victoria that they roamed over, following the food chain and reliable water supplies. The Broken River area, as it was later known by the early settlers, was inhabited by the Pangurang (sometimes spelt Bangerang or Bangurang) and the Taoungurong (sometimes spelt Taungurong) tribes.


In late 1824 the area was explored by Hume and Hovell and the district became known as Broken River. The township of Swanpool developed as a stop on the main road between rail facilities at Benalla and Mansfield. The first mention of Swan Pool (two words), Samaria and Lima are on a map drawn of the Lima Station in 1847. Simple tracks were developed and squatters began settling in the area followed soon after by Government officials. Large areas of common lands were gazetted with some later being subdivided to meet the demand for smaller farm size blocks between 1855 and 1865. As more settlers came and stayed, schools, churches and public facilities emerged and later butter factories, sawmills, quarries, shops and post offices. Delivery runs of mail, bread and other supplies emanated out of Swanpool to the surrounding valleys.


Swanpool Today*


Swanpool is a picturesque town with a primary school, strong sporting clubs, a general store, museum, post office and the Swanpool Cinema. The recently completed Heritage Murals at Swanpool depict some of the early commercial operations in the area. Agriculture, horticulture, forestry, quarrying, and tourism are the main business operations in the district.

At the 2016 census, Swanpool and the surrounding area had a total population of 208, with 106 males and 104 females. Of these, 16 residents were born overseas and 9 need assistance due to age or disability. Education statistics show 15 children attend pre - school or primary school, 14 attend secondary school and 7 attend TAFE. Housing statistics show 48 residents own their homes, 27 are purchasing and 11 are renting.
