Executive Summary

This document details a community led action plan that showcases a vision for the progressive development of Tatong. The document also outlines the plan to both maintain and enhance the future prosperity of the township through ongoing planning and development of the town and its community members, including infrastructure, maintenance, community inclusion & promotion and events to increase tourism.

Vision Statement:

To improve Tatong for residents to reside and work, visitors to stay, and for the future prosperity of Tatong from a social, economic, recreational and environmental perspective; whilst maintaining the character intrinsic to the community.

To engender good-will, build partnerships between local groups and the residents of Baddaginnie, and promote a spirit of co-operation. To ensure initiatives have a greater likelihood of being supported, by how they are perceived by the community and for volunteers to support projects.

Purpose of the Township Plan:

The Tatong Township Plan is based on the ideas, hopes and aspirations of the Tatong community together with the Benalla Rural City Council (BRCC). The Township Plan aspires to guide the future development of the town by developing a list of projects and priorities to inform council strategic planning and to support the community to apply for grants when funding is available.

The plan:

- Articulates the issues that are important to Tatong residents
- Provides a clear blueprint for the future development of the Tatong township and surrounding region
- Assists the Tatong community to attract local and state funding to help achieve identified priorities and projects
- Provides a coordinated approach for the social, cultural and economic development of the township and surrounding enterprises
- Aspires to promote Tatong as a tourism destination & as a great place to live


Alignment to BRCC Community Plan & Vision 2036



Location

Tatong is a rural town on the northern foothills of the Blue Ranges which form part of the Great Dividing Range and sits alongside Holland Creek. It is located in northeastern Victoria, 28 kms from the rural city of Benalla and 226 kms north east of Melbourne.





History of Tatong


The township of Tatong was established in the late 1800 with the post office opening in 1890 (closed in 1993). A general store, hotel, state primary school, football, and tennis grounds, among other things were also established. In 1914, a railway from Benalla to Tatong was opened along with a railway station in town. Timber from the surrounding hills was harvested to supply the early Melbourne power station, until coal from the Latrobe Valley became the favoured fuel source.


In February 1928, staff were withdrawn from Tatong railway station. Persistent operating losses on the operation of the line led its closure in July 1947. That together with dwindling patronage of the rail line to Benalla led to the closing of the rail line after World War II. The town of Tatong has seen many changes over the last century and the area is now a mixture of farmland, pine plantations and dense bush.


Tatong Today*


The town of Tatong has a hotel - the Tatong Tavern, a memorial hall and sports ground. It has an active sporting community with archery, cricket, tennis and table tennis clubs. The Tatong Football & Netball club was ceased in 2014. Other groups include the Tatong Angling Group, Tatong Heritage Group and the Tatong Young Bloods. Locals and tourists enjoy the renowned Tatong Tavern. Community events are held there including the Royal Children's Good Friday Appeal Auction, the monthly Tatong Market and the bi-monthly Neighbourhood Watch meetings.

According to the 2016 census, Tatong had a total population of 291 with 145 males and 148 females in 2016. Of these, 27 residents were born overseas and 12 require assistance due to age or disability. Education statistics show 33 attend pre - school or primary school, 17 attend secondary school and 5 attend TAFE. There were 126 dwellings with 46 residents own their own homes, 40 are purchasing and 4 are renting.

What makes Tatong Unique

Tatong today is a small town near the snow fields, wineries and has places of historic interest including the old tram line, the Kelly and Cork Trees. The area is a mixture of farmland, pine plantations and dense bush. It has varied and abundant bird and wildlife as well as scenic vistas and unique flora and fauna.

The Tatong community are committed to maintaining organised and ad hoc sporting and recreational events, such as the weekly exercise group, the archery and fishing clubs. The residents consider the town to be a healthy, restful, vibrant and beautiful community in which to live.
