Executive Summary

This document details a community led action plan that showcases a vision for the progressive development of Winton. The document also outlines the plan to both maintain and enhance the future prosperity of the township through ongoing planning and development of the town and its community members, including infrastructure, maintenance, community inclusion & promotion and events to increase tourism.

Vision Statement:

To improve Winton for residents to reside and work, visitors to stay, and for the future prosperity of Winton from a social, economic, recreational and environmental perspective; whilst maintaining the character intrinsic to the community.

To engender good-will, build partnerships between local groups and the residents of Winton, and promote a spirit of co-operation. To ensure initiatives have a greater likelihood of being supported, by how they are perceived by the community and for volunteers to support projects.

Purpose of the Township Plan

The Winton Township Plan is based on the ideas, hopes and aspirations of the Winton community together with the Benalla Rural City Council (BRCC). The Township Plan aspires to guide the future development of the town by developing a list of projects and priorities to inform council strategic planning and to support the community to apply for grants when funding is available.

The plan:

- Articulates the issues that are important to Winton residents
- Provides a clear blueprint for the future development of the Winton township and surrounding region
- Assists the Winton community to attract local and state funding to help achieve identified priorities and projects
- Provides a coordinated approach for the social, cultural and economic development of the township and surrounding enterprises
- Aspires to promote Winton as a tourism destination & as a great place to live

Alignment to BRCC Community Plan & Vision 2036

The Winton Township Plan aligns with the BRCC Community Plan and Vision 2036 documents respectively as together they seek to provide a pathway to the development of individual towns and the rural area of Benalla as a whole.

Winton is a small rural town within the local government area of Benalla. It is located approximately 174kms northeast of Melbourne.



History of Winton

The town of Winton was proclaimed on 25 February 1861. It was named by district surveyor J.G.W. Wilmot, apparently after Winton, Cumbria, where he was said to have been born.


Winton Today*


According to the 2016 Census, Winton and the surrounding district had a population of 110 in 2016, with 59 males and 52 females. Of these, 8 were born overseas and 8 require assistance due to age or disability. Education statistics show 3 children attend pre - school or primary school, 4 attend secondary school and 4 attend TAFE. There are 47 dwellings, 13 residents own their own homes, 17 are purchasing and 0 are renting.


