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Executive Summary

This document details a community led action plan that showcases a vision for the progressive development of Moorngag. The document also outlines the plan to both maintain and enhance the future prosperity of the township through ongoing planning and development of the town and its community members, including infrastructure, maintenance, community inclusion & promotion and events to increase tourism.

Vision Statement:

To improve Moorngag for residents to reside and work, visitors to stay, and for the future prosperity of Winton from a social, economic, recreational and environmental perspective; whilst maintaining the character intrinsic to the community.

To engender good-will, build partnerships between local groups and the residents of Moorngag, and promote a spirit of co-operation. To ensure initiatives have a greater likelihood of being supported, by how they are perceived by the community and for volunteers to support projects.

Purpose of the Township Plan:

The Moorngag Township Plan is based on the ideas, hopes and aspirations of the Moorngag community together with the Benalla Rural City Council (BRCC). The Township Plan aspires to guide the future development of the town by developing a list of projects and priorities to inform council strategic planning and to support the community to apply for grants when funding is available.

The plan:


- Articulates the issues that are important to Moorngag residents

Location

Moorngag is a small Victorian Rural Location within the local government area of Benalla and is 25 kms southeast from the township. It is located approximately 230 kms northeast from Melbourne.





History of Moorngag

Moorngag community is a small rural community bounded by Tatong, Swanpool and Samaria. The quaint rural hall is over 128 years old.

Moorngag Today*


The community hosts regular lunches and dinners throughout the year where new residents to the area are welcomed and older residents gather to catch up with each other. It is also the venue for table tennis enthusiasts who meet weekly throughout the winter season for competition.

Moorngag and the surrounding district had a population of 97 in 2016, with 47 males and 49 females. Of these, 4 were born overseas and 0 require assistance due to age or disability. Education statistics show 10 children attend pre - school or primary school, 17 attend secondary school and 0 attend TAFE. There are 40 dwellings, 14 residents own their own homes, 12 are purchasing and 0 are renting.



HOUSEHOLD TYPES




LABOUR FORCE
